5K Walk/Run in New Jersey

It was early in the morning of July 28th and still dark outside. Three school buses lined up across the street from the hotel waiting for its passengers. In the crisp cool air, the herd of people with various colored matching shirts and race bibs made their way to the buses and loaded on in an orderly fashion. iLDP - An Online Leadership Development Program

On March 17, 2018, the Philippine Nurses Association of America (PNAA) launched the 12-week iLDP Program, an online leadership development program based on four elements: Inspiration,

Infrastructure, Education and Evidence, a concept by Jayne Felgen, who authored the book, Leading Lasting Change. This program was led by Mindy Ofiana - Lead; Manny Ramos - Co-Lead; Amelia Guzman - Education Chair and Pete Calixto - Adviser.

The goal was to provide an organized and systematic process of acculturating incoming chapter leaders to PNAA by providing information regarding its history, structure and procedures and bi-directional role expectations for ease of integration to our organization and seamless role transition. The online program invited initial cohorts of 46 Presidents-Elect of 2016-2018 who are going to be the Chapter President for 2018-2020. It brought together 27 interested Presidents-Elect.

Seventy-eight percent, (21 out of 27) successfully completed the program, fifteen percent withdrew (4 out of 27), and seven percent dropped the course after the first week of the program (2 out of 27).

2018 Outstanding Filipino American Nurses

Long Beach, California – The Philippine Heritage Institute International, a private foundation, presented last Saturday to a full house, its "Tribute 2018" which acknowledged awardees under two distinct categories, The White House Millennium Council Initiative: 20th Annual "Award to Outstanding Filipino American Nurses," and the 12th Annual President's Award: "Profiles in Service, Pillars of Community." The Long Beach Marriott was teeming with nurses, doctors and their families dressed to the hilt to honor their own. If one had a medical emergency during the event, it was the best place to have one.

PHII was established in 1989 focused on the advancement of Filipino Americans through youth development programs, volunteerism, and the promotion of Filipino Culture. Ten years later after a historic and poignant meeting between its founder, Naomi Palma Armada, and President Bill Clinton and wife, Hillary, when they came to Los Angeles to promote their initiative the "White House Millennium Council," Armada was inspired to create the "Millennium Recognition Awards after the theme "Honor the Past, Imagine the Future."

Mrs. Armada's narrative stated that she chose the award's name "to pay tribute to outstanding individuals whose contributions have enhanced the quality of life in the community. I also chose our nurses for their hands-on above and beyond compassionate service, volunteerism and their sheer numbers in the Healthcare workplace. People stranger to me were positive in their response to my choice. Each one has a nice thing or two to say about Filipino nurses who have touched their lives and their loved ones at vulnerable moments."

Filipino Medical practitioners, particularly, nurses, have been a visible presence in many hospitals across the nation. Many swear by their professionalism and exceptional caring and compassion, yet, they are taken for granted and is even "invisible" to Hollywood. Although that has changed somewhat when **Saturday Night Live** star Michael Che made mention on national TV during the recently concluded **Emmy Awards** when he said, "TV has always had a diversity problem. I mean, can you believe they did 15 seasons of ER without one Filipino nurse? Have you been to a hospital?"

On September 12, 2018, A Nurses Road to Career Advancement, a professional development event, took place in collaboration with Kaiser Permanente. Led by PNASC member and past Executive Board Officer, Sharon Fabellar-Sia, Sunset Kaiser was the back drop for four of our PNASC leaders who participated as panel experts providing insight to their role as advance practice nurses and doctoral degree nurses.

Per Ms Fabellar-Sia: "KP Los Angeles Medical Center is on Magnet Journey. I also value Professional Growth of our front-line staff/clinical nurses. I developed Mentoring Program, known as "Table Talk with Sharon." The intent is to connect my front-line staff with mentors who voluntarily signed up to be part of the program.

Our PNASC President Dr. Reggie Valerio is one of our mentors and he is mentoring our 2 Clinical nurses: Patricia Siapno and Jeffrey Saguin who will be facilitating this event; together with Dr. Reggie .

I also value the collaboration between Acute care setting and Professional Organization. My first goal in mind is PNASC..then I will connect next time with Black Nurses Association or Hispanic Nurses Association. ..also STTI and others. We also value inclusiveness and we really embrace diversed staff members.

Membership Recruitment & Retention Drive

GOAL: To increase membership by providing incentive for

recruitment and retention

DEFINITION:

Recruit – new member to PNASC or non-renewal of >2 years 2 renewals = 1 recruit

Renewal – current members that are continuing membership

TIMEFRAME:

Recruitment: July 2017 – July 2018 Retention: Within 1 month of renewal date PROCESS:

RECRUITMENT

1. Any current/active PNASC/PNAA member may recruit

2. With every 4 recruit (or 2 renewal = 1 recruit) a free PNASC/PNAA membership for the next year will be given.

3. Lifetime members will receive free PNAA membership for 1 year and non-lifetime PNASC member will receive free membership to PNASC/PNAA for the upcoming year

4. For 2-year memberships, the second year will count as a renewal for the next year for the recruiter. (The recruiter will only have to recruit 3 new members and another renewal to get another free year membership)


